




What is the ultimate goal of our community based economic development program/project?








The cycles of CECD

The 7 concepts...

- 1. Emphasizing on holistic development, "human" development, community based, contextualized, and local capacity
- 2. Networking; GOs, NGOs, business sectors as supporters but the local community as a center for the EC movement
- 3. Start from local to national level: CBO is as a significant mechanism for development and to respond to their real need(s) continually (by themselves).

The 7 concepts...

- 4. Participation of Groups and Networks in their learning and development process; education, safety, production, marketing, resource mobilization, natural resource management, culture and tradition preservation, etc
- 5. EC activities create learning experiences and various opportunities, so people will have more options according to their gender, ages, education, skills, and EC status


- 6. Sufficiency Economics of the king
- 7. Local communities and organizations become self supporting

4 facts should be considered as a development organization promoting community based economics development


- Fact #1 Most development organizations have been funded from uncertain funding from oversea countries are not sustainable.
- Fact #2 The ultimate goal(s) or expectation(s) of a development organization is when before they leave the target community, they want to see their community development work sustained by the local people, but there is no development organization that is survive from their self-supporting.
- Fact #3 There are 2 types of people who stay survive through the sufficiency economics' methodology/theory which are a) those gain higher education and or graduated people, and b) those own asset
- Fact #4 target groups of development organizations are marginalized people lacking of opportunities, knowledge, capacity and asset. So how can they become self sufficiency and sustainability?

and together with practicing
unity among people.




The diagram of Sustainable Community based Economic Development



Stage 2 (community sufficiency) – to support people come together in groups or cooperatives, supporting one another through the process of production, marketing, well-being, social services, education and spiritual

The diagram of Sustainable Community based Economic Development


Stage 3 (country sufficiency) – to promote collaboration with organizations within the country such as banks, large companies, and research institutions, to support one another and strengthen the chain of sufficiency economics.
